

<u>Shannon Hurn</u> DEF - \$472,000

Very underpriced for a player of Hurn's calibre. Don't just look at his average of 87 for last year. He started off a little bit quiet over 3-4 rounds but then went gangbusters for 7 rounds, including 5 tons in a row. He scored an 8 in the game when he got injured and was unseen again last year. He only needs 15 touches to score a SuperCoach ton (not an exaggeration) because of his long, effective and rebounding kicks. At his value I would consider him over a few 480-510k players. He is my D3, but he may even be able to sneak into your D4 depending on your financial structuring; highly recommended by me.

Others to consider.....

Matt Priddis - MID - \$544,500

Honestly thought he'd gained more attention after his last few years, but he hasn't, a selection rate of 1.49% suggests. He's averaged over 100 for the past 4 years, but the lowest of that was last year. 114 average in 2011 and 110 in 2013. Only 100 last year, but if he can tip that back to near 110 or even 105, then 540k is huge value. He handballs a lot, but that doesn't matter because he is on the bottom of the packs regularly, extracting the ball via contested possessions.

Scott Selwood - MID - \$559,800

Averaged 103-104 the last two years and at 23 years old (almost 24) he only has an upside. He scores really big at times but can have the odd bad game. Quite often the bad games are a direct result of a mix of tagging roles and a few frees against. Hopefully he can find the ball more while tagging, or even better, he may be required to tag less.
